Anna Škodenko

Spatially unsettled, at an uncertain time you may stumble upon me, or I may find you.

Most likely I am a stranger, moving without a plan I may collide with your meandering trajectory. One cannot meet a stranger intentionally. We can only encounter each other by chance, pretending that this was the plan.

Encharmed, I feel dissolving in the surroundings, but remaining foreign for them. My language disappears. I hardly remember the sound of my voice. If one will ask me anything — I'll be lost in a forest of possible answers.

I'll fill the void with sound. I guess it is my voice, or just some voice at my disposal.

I am searching for comfort in the inability to find ground, to solidify, predict. Indefiniteness cannot be domesticated, but we can try.

2. Jessie Bullivant

Jessie Bullivant *The Tower* (2nd ed.) 2020 Limited edition reprint of *The Tower* (originally published in August 2020) Supported by bespoke newspaper sticks by Minna Miettilä.

The Tower was written over the 2020 summer at HIAP Suomenlinna and originally presented in a single-day exhibition at the Haukilahti water tower in Espoo in August. *The Tower* is an auto-fictive text comprising 9 chapters, each bearing the title of a body fluid. A second edition of this text has been printed as a broadsheet newspaper, and will be presented in Jessie Bullivant's studio supported by bespoke newspaper sticks produced by Minna Miettilä.

3. Elis Hannikainen

Elis Hannikainen shows work in progress, two text videos and installation work for two projects.

Distress Run is a common project together with artist and writer Vappu Jalonen. *Distress Run* is based on the artists' experiences of endurance sports, and centres on moving bodies that are exposed to norms, able to feel enjoyment, depressed and in need of support.

Hannikainen's second project *This Isn't Consoling* considers the body as something that needs sealing and sheltering.

4. Johanna Ketola

In the HIAP Open Studios I am showing a work-in-progress version of one part of a multi-part installation *For G, as Ground*. In the studio you see "a reader" in a video installation format and during the weekend combined with sound and live performative gestures. At the core of this work is a poem, written as a sort of contemporary lament. In this work-in-progress I also work with kind of material-semantic non-sense, which could articulate interests during the residency time; semantic gaps combined with material sameness and homologies. Also a publication formation from the summer residency time is on display.

The work in progress *For G, as Ground* turns into a performative installation on Saturday between 15:00-16:30 and on Sunday between 14:30-16:00 at Studio no. 4 at HIAP Studios.

6. Anikó Kuikka

At the open studio in focus will be the visible process, traces and snippets of the making of *ELÄIN ANIMAL DJUR* but perhaps also on the background some of the earlier works Anikó has been working on at HIAP since October 2019.

8. Ilya Orlov

I am currently working on the project *Functional Art* which takes as its starting point the widespread belief that art matters, has a use, or at least should be somehow functional. I decided to consider these ideas seriously, testing them practically so that they resulted in artworks of two categories: "art aimed to save the world" and "art aimed to save the artist". Both comprise the show *Functional Art* at Emanuel studio, which is turned for HIAP Open Studios Week into a small but nevertheless two-storey exhibition hall. The visitors are welcome to decide which artwork belongs to which group, and whether it serves its function well enough or indeed the opposite.

14:00-18:00 The Post-Fossil Show Location: HIAP Gallery Augusta

A rapid transition from the infrastructure and cultural practices reliant on fossil energy sources towards post-fossil solutions is essential in order to slow down climate change and reach the goals of The Paris Agreement. The post-fossil transition is a major cultural paradigm shift cutting through all spheres of life.

The Post-Fossil Transition project as well as the exhibition strive to challenge the currently dominant paradigms and tropes related to ecological sustainability. The artworks in the show point towards the blind spots we have in our discourse and understanding, as well as propose experiences and perspectives that exist outside the domain of reason and language.

As a historical reference point the exhibition includes a selection of material from the seminal Suomenlinna 1968 seminar. The event carried a strong sense of urgency related to sustainability and had a strong impact in the development of Finnish design culture. The event also challenged the conventions and key paradigms of the era, with contributions from Buckminster Fuller, Victor Papanek and many others.

One key goal of the project has been to reduce the organisations' dependency on fossil fuels. The three key focus areas in this process have been Travel, Food and Energy. During the course of three years, HIAP managed to make changes that greatly reduced the organisation's fossil fuel footprint.

Included in the exhibition is The Post-Fossil Library, literature that informed the learning processes on ecological transition and sustainability.

The Diaspora is a House too: a work-in-progress screening of Berlin-based ex-HIAP resident Pinar Öğrenci's new documentary work titled *Gurbet Is a Home Now*. The screening is followed by a discussion tied in with the work of current HIAP resident Minou Norouzi on the themes of architecture and migration.

Gurbet Is a Home Now is a documentary by architect and artist Pınar Öğrenci. The film puts under critical review the urban planning principles in 1980s Berlin that displaced migrants through occupancy quotas and the so-called Zuzugssperre. Considered by urban planners as "careful urban renewal" this policy effectively prohibited non-European citizens moving to areas with existing migrant communities of a certain size.

Öğrenci constructs a heartfelt, humorous, critical view of urban planning in 1980s Berlin. She puts at the centre of the film the personal experiences and solidarity amongst the women migrants and inhabitants of one of Berlin's most consequential urban renewal projects: the International Building Exhibition 1984-87 also known as IBA 1984-87. Öğrenci draws on Esra Akcan's book Open Architecture: Migration, Citizenship and the Urban Renewal of Berlin-Kreuzberg by IBA 1984-87 and interviews conducted by Akcan. Alongside this, Öğrenci uncovers the photographic archive of Heide Moldenhauer, one of the few female architects of the IBA urban renewal project. Öğrenci's film puts into poetic reflection the idea of "place" and presents a substantial reappraisal of a slice of Kreuzberg history that has remained in the shadows.
