I was told I chop wood like a ballet dancer is a body of work that has grown as a collective effort. Following the origin of the word concert – to contest, question, dispute (with) as well as agreement in action. The text on the record cites both sentences and form from Gertrude Stein's *A Circular Play* (1920) as well as the musical version *In Circles* (1967). Material is stolen as a form of appreciation from a number of sources.

You are encouraged to stay and use the sketchbook and the materials provided to record your immediate environment. This process-based project is about how we view and see the world around us. Using embroidery and textile work as a means of sketching is a process that requires focus, close attention, and patience. These images cannot be erased, cannot be turned into whole again, but can be repaired and mended.

How to get there

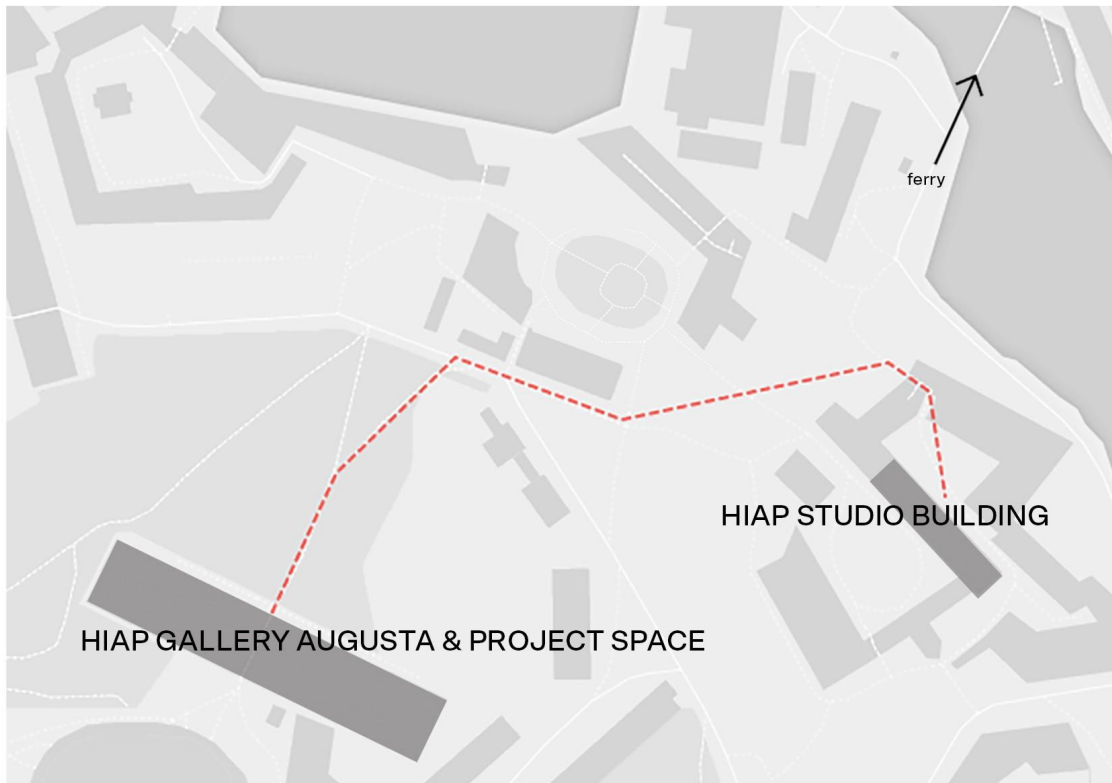
Ferries run by HSL and the privately operated JT-Line water buses. The ferries leave from the Market Square (Kauppatori).

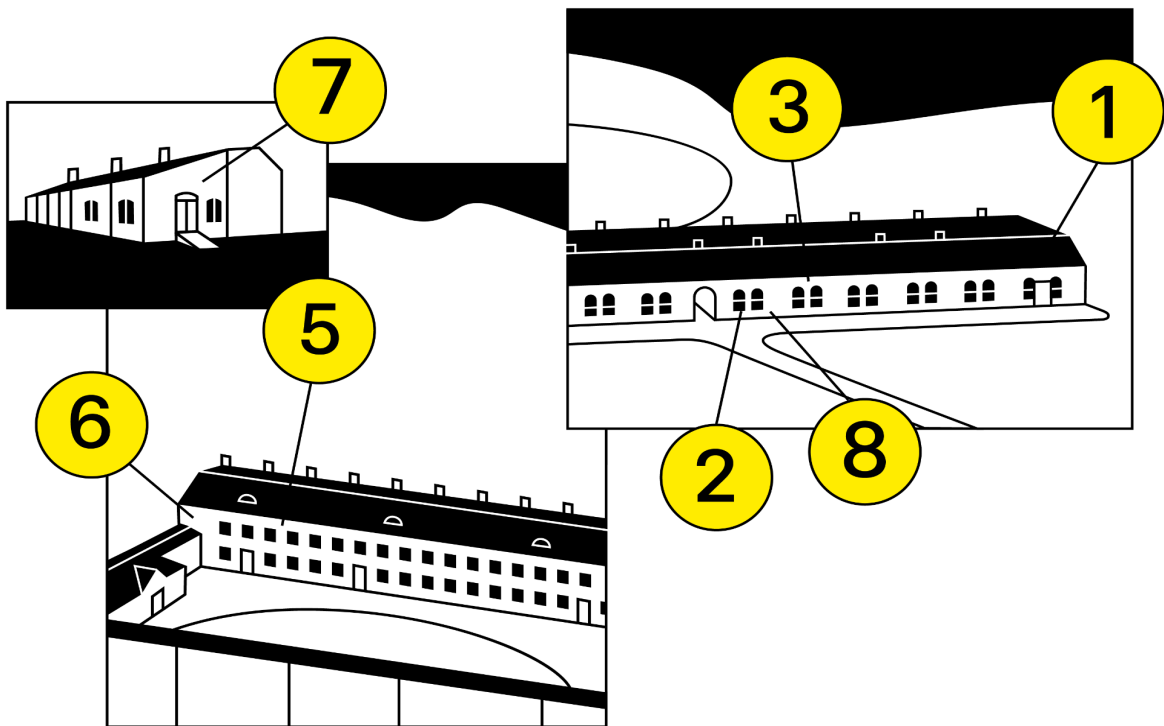

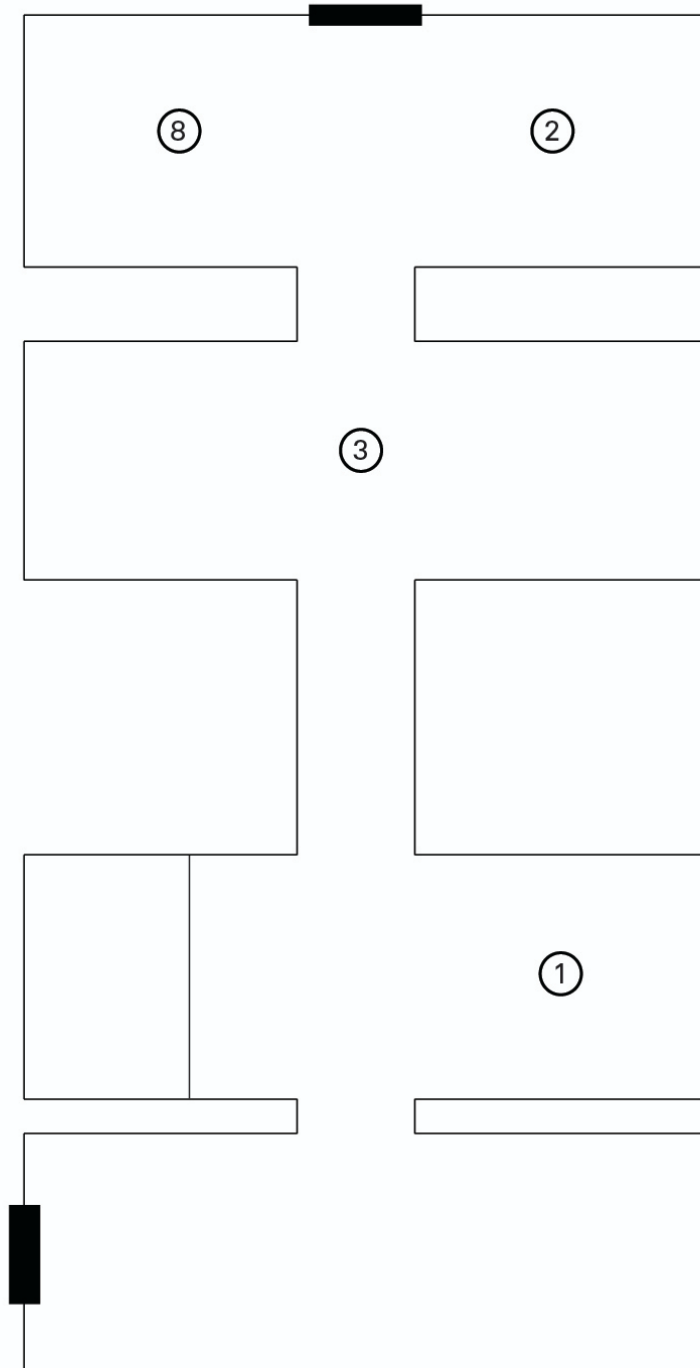
MAPS OF THE HIAP OPEN STUDIOS LOCATIONS
