

A situated textile constellation by curator Konul Rafiyeva with the artists Elina Juopperi, Shweta Dash and Verneri Salonen

Meeting point: Field outside of Gallery Augusta

What happens when textile becomes not a medium, but a method of listening? In Textile Traces / Soft Activations, curator and researcher Konul Rafiyeva proposes a tender, durational gesture, a textile constellation woven from stories, gestures, and shared processes. The work acknowledges its temporariness, resisting a final form in favour of process and participation. Viewers are invited to enter, witness, perhaps touch. There is no performance in the theatrical sense. Rather, a sequence of intimate activations: Juopperi lifts the silk from the ground. Rafiyeva responds. A shared breath becomes a conversation. Rather than resolving into meaning, Textile Traces / Soft Activations opens a space of co-presence. Here, textile is not an object, but a relationship.


A Curatorial Conversation with Konul Rafiyeva and Madeleine Collie

Meeting point: Studio Elias

This participatory gathering unfolds as a curatorial duet between Azerbaijani curator and researcher Konul Rafiyeva and Australian born curator and writer Madeleine Collie. The format is simple yet layered: a table, an open stove, shared gestures, and stories cooked into form. Madeleine's practice of working with plants, ferments, colonial histories and archival traces meets Konul's in this culinary space to reflect on embodied and ecological knowledge. Together, they construct a space where acts of cooking, sharing, touching, listening become curatorial tools for bridging geographies and practices.

This one-hour event invites the public to witness, share, and taste not simply the food, but a moment of artistic hospitality where the table becomes an archive, and conversation becomes a shelter.

"Dragon's Teeth

Anti-tank obstacles, or dragon's teeth, are fortification structures shaped like pyramidal blocks. Today, these structures are deployed in the ongoing russian-Ukrainian war and along the borders of Lithuania, Latvia, Estonia, and Finland. Miniature pyramids made from different types of granite from the Fennoscandian Shield, the geological formation runs along the northeastern European border. "

IDEN SUNGYOUNG KIM

From the Manhattan project to the Fukushima nuclear accident, the terminology of nuclear research has transformed with its political and ecological circumstances involving multinational interests and political contradictions. Presented together with two-channel videos from the archival research, a short film trailer and research presentation investigates the collective memory of imperialism and historical repetition rooted in nuclear discourse.

NATALIIA KUSHNIR

intimate animation \cdot silent, contemplation \cdot for those who wait \cdot for those who fly \cdot for those who stay

Ukrainian artist Nataliia Kushnir presents her clay animation "If There's a Place to Return."

A quiet journey through clay, light, and landscapes — inspired by the nature of Finland and the memory of Ukraine. This is a story about staying, leaving, and returning. About silence that speaks, and the earth that listens.

MAAIJKE MIDDELBEEK

Bioart · SF storytelling · exploration of becoming with · human-algae symbiosis · human-sea relations

I present Homo Photosynthesis: a chimera symbiotically entangled with the photosynthetic breath of algae — an artistic response to ever rising CO2. A transformation that explores new and old human-sea and human-algae relations and algae-friendly cultivation with locally taken samples, shown in documentation. Inspired by plant-animals, I created phyto-membranes and prostheses with microalgae to embody human-algae symbiosis.

LARA SANSOUR


a video art combined with an installation · an invitation to sit on the floor

The work is a dialogue between two stories I collected through interviews with a weaver from Al-Majdal city, Hussam Zaqout. He appears to be the only remaining Palestinian weaver who inherited the craft from his father. The artwork combines an installation of a loom—an imagined reconstruction—and a video sound piece. Both aim to interweave the remnants of memory with the ongoing erasure of Palestinian identity.
